Venepuncture Competency Assessment

Learners should self-assess their competence, signing the form when they feel they have achieved the required elements. This assessment of competency should also be completed by a registered health care professional (RHCP) who is appropriately trained and competent in the venepuncture skill and has witnessed the learner demonstrating all elements of the knowledge and practical skills.

If you (the learner) do not feel confident or competent, it is your responsibility to make your practice supervisor or manager aware. You should not undertake any skill independently until you feel confident to do so.

To achieve competency sign-off the learner should be able to successfully, demonstrate the required knowledge, practical skills, and feel confident in the procedure they are undertaking.
